SEB Mixed Fund 80 – a sub-fund of SEB Fund 3

Objectives and Investment Policy

This actively managed fund aims to increase the value of your investment over time by outperforming the benchmark. The fund manager uses analysis and selection based on the prevailing market outlook to make active investment decisions.

The fund invests directly or indirectly in equities, debt securities and money market instruments. The fund targets an exposure of 80% in global equities and equity-related securities, including emerging market equities. However, the fund's net exposure to equities may vary over time between 60% and 100%, depending on market factors.

We compare the fund's performance to a composite index: 30% MSCI Europe Net Return Index, 21% MSCI North America Net Return Index, 11% MSCI Japan Net Return Index, 10% MSCI Emerging Markets Net Return Index, 8% OMX Helsinki Cap Return Index, 7% Bloomberg Euro Aggregate Treasury index, 13% Euribor 3M Index. The fund's investment strategy does not aim to limit the extent to which the fund's holdings deviate from the benchmark. The manager is therefore not constrained by the benchmark. The majority of the fund's holdings may be constituents of the benchmark but rather differ in weighting.

The fund may invest up to 100% of its net assets in units or shares of other funds. The fund may invest in funds with exposure

to asset classes, such as, but not limited to, asset-backed securities, mortgage-backed securities, collateralized loan obligations, commodities and closed-end Real Estate Investment Trusts.

The fund may use derivatives to achieve its investment objectives as well as for hedging and other efficient portfolio management purposes. Derivatives are a type of financial instrument, the value of which is derived from underlying financial instruments.

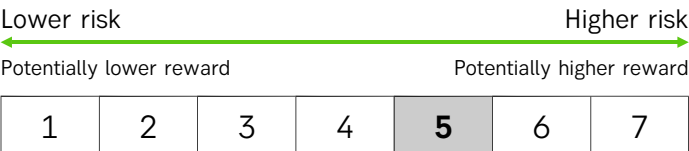

Generally, investors can buy or sell units of the fund on any bank business day in Luxembourg except 24 and 31 December.

The unit class is non-distributing.

Risk and Reward Profile



The risk and reward indicator illustrates the relationship between risk and the expected return for the fund. The higher the fund is positioned on this scale, the greater the possible reward, but also the greater risk of losing money. Category 1 does not mean that the investment is risk free.

The risk category is calculated using historical data or simulated historical performance when actual historical data is insufficient. Past performance may not be a reliable indicator of the fund's future risk and reward profile.

This fund is in category 5. This means that the risk for value changes in the fund is medium. This category may change over time.

We manage the risk primarily by allocating among the different asset classes in the fund's investment universe. This diversification affects the fund's total risk. The total risk is greatly affected by the covariation between the asset classes and does not always reflect the actual risk in each asset class.

The following risks are not fully reflected in the above classification but still influence the fund's value:

Credit risk - the fund invests directly or indirectly in bonds or other fixed income related instruments. If an issuer of a bond fails to pay the interest and principal amount on time, the bond could lose up to its entire value.

Counterparty risk - if a counterparty does not fulfill its obligations to the fund (e.g. not paying an agreed amount or not delivering securities as agreed).

Liquidity risk - some of the assets of the fund may become difficult to sell at a certain time and for a reasonable price.

Operational risk - the risk of loss resulting from e.g. system breakdowns, human errors or from external events.

Currency risk - the fund invests in securities that are issued in currencies other than the base currency of the fund. As a result the fund is subject to currency risk, which arises from changes in the exchange rates.

Interest rate risk - debt instruments may be subject to price fluctuations due to interest rates changes. When interest rates rise, bond values usually decline. When interest rates decline, bond values usually rise.

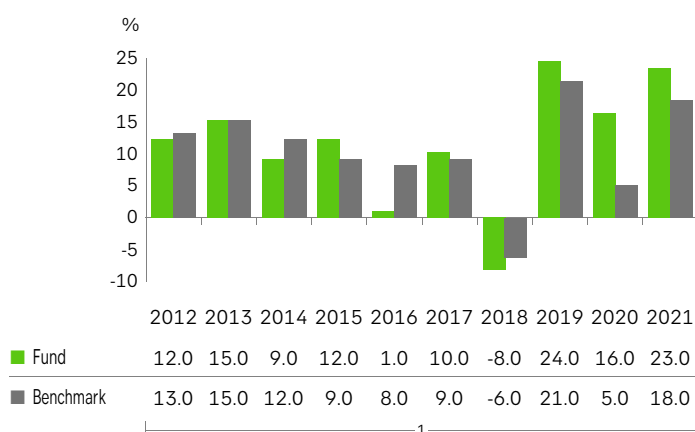
The Fund does not levy any entry charge or exit charge. In certain markets, however, these charges may be levied by distributors. We recommend that you contact your local distributor. Ongoing charges are used to pay the costs of running the fund, including the costs of marketing and distribution.

The Management Company may charge an additional exit charge of up to 2% of the NAV of the units redeemed within six months of their issue.

The ongoing charges figure is an estimate, based on the projected costs for the fund. The figure is estimated because the fund or unit class was newly launched. The figure includes the underlying funds' annual fees, as well as subscription fees, redemption fees and performance-based fees if they are relevant. If our fund invests in funds with SEB in their name, it is compensated for the management fee in the underlying SEB fund. Transaction costs are not included in ongoing charges. The fund's annual report describes the exact charges. The figure may vary from year to year.
